


On Saturday, December 12, TWU Local 100 celebrates our striking history with a special salute to the men and women who were there taking Mike Quill's back on January 1, 1966 when "every wheel stopped" on all of the buses and trains in New York City. We have invited every TWU member who was active during the 1966 strike to be our guest at the December Mass Membership Meeting at the Manhattan Center – the same place where Mike Quill held so many rallies that built the power of our great Union. The 1966 strike – which won unprecedented wage and benefits increases for

the TWU membership – was a milestone for TWU Local 100.

Faced with management intransigence, we struck the City for the first time back then, and the City responded by arresting Mike Quill and our top officers, who were jailed while the rank and file walked the picket lines. Shortly after being released from jail and seeing the new contract concluded, Mike Quill died of a heart attack. We'll remember all this at the December 12, 2015 meeting. **Be there!**
