

We Remember William Pena. Let's Show Our Support by Coming to Court on August 11th

In the early morning of February 12, 2014, Domonic Whilby, a drunk driver, (below right) drove a stolen truck into Bus Operator William Pena's M14 bus. The bus was forced off the street into an office building, and William died from the impact. *It's been over two years, and William's family is still waiting for justice.*

The evidence against Domonic Whilby will be presented to Judge Gregory Carro on Thursday, August 11th at 9AM. William's family asks that all transit workers who are able to attend the hearing – to show the judge that we are here for each other and our families.

What happened to William could happen to any transit worker, anywhere, any time.
