

NOTICE AND RULES

RERUN ELECTION – MTA BUS DIVISION

By decision of the Neutral Monitor, the Local 100 TWU Election of MTA Bus Division Executive Board Members, Division Officers, Convention Delegates, and Alternative Convention Delegates is being rerun. **Ballots will be mailed out on January 3, 2019 to members in good standing as of December 1, 2018. Ballots must be received by the American Arbitration Association (“AAA”) on or before 4:00 p.m. on Monday, January 28, 2019.** The count will occur at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, January 29, 2019 at AAA, 120 Broadway, Basement Floor.

Nominations: There will be no new nominations.

Observers – Mailing of Ballots: Observers may be present for the stuffing and mailing of the ballots. Please contact the Election Committee for information as to location and time.

Ballot Pick-Up and Check In: Ballots will be picked up on a daily basis at 10:30am from the Church Street Post Office and brought to the AAA office beginning on January 7, 2019. The last ballot pick up will be at 6pm on January 28, 2019. The check-off and sorting process will begin on January 24, 2019 between 9am and 5pm. Those who wish to observe should call the Election Committee at 212-873-6000 to make arrangements to watch the mail pick-up, and to get exact times for the ballot check off. The ballot check-off will take place in the AAA office at 120 Broadway, New York, N.Y.

Replacement Ballots: Members in good standing may call the AAA at 800-529-5218 between 9am and 5pm for a replacement ballot starting on January 10, 2019. The last day to request a ballot will be Wednesday January 23, 2019.

Observers at the Count - Observers may be present for the count utilizing the same procedure as used in the December 6, 2018 count.

Protests: All protest procedures shall remain the same as in the December 6, 2018 election. Candidates and members are reminded that protests must be filed with the Neutral Monitor within 48 hours of the discovery of an alleged Rule violation. Protests about the procedure on the day of the count must be expressed at the Count. Post-count protests may be sent to the Neutral Monitor on or before noon on February 3, 2019.

Review of the Mailing List: Candidates may review the mailing list beginning December 21, 2018 at the Election Committee Office at 195 Montague Street, Brooklyn, New York.

Members Addresses: Members are responsible for updating their mailing addresses with the Union and the MTA BSC, which supplies addresses to the union. Anyone who did not receive a ballot during the previous round of voting, or who had a ballot forwarded to them should notify the Election Committee of your new or correct address.

Use of Union Resources and Facilities:

a) Phone numbers and email addresses utilized by Local 100 or collected by Local 100 officers and staff may not be used for campaign purposes unless arranged as per the Rules of the initial election. This includes text message groups. If text message groups are used by officers to publish union notices they may not be used to promote a candidacy.

b) Union offices, including windows and walls, and union bulletin boards may not be used to advertise or promote any candidacy. Where the union has locked bulletin boards, all candidates shall be given an equal opportunity to post campaign literature.

c) The placement of stickers on management property, while not violative of these rules, is discouraged, since management prohibits the defacing of its property, and uneven enforcement of its rules could lead to charges of favoritism
