WANTED FOR CRIMES AGAINST TRANSIT WORKERS

- 1. Wanted for repeatedly punching a Liberty Lines Bus Operator on Aug. 30, 2017, at approximately 9:40 a.m., at the corner of Light St. and Dyre Ave. in the Bronx. The Bus Operator required surgery to his left shoulder and right hand because of injuries inflicted during the beating.
- 2. Wanted for spitting on a 57-year-old Bus Operator and throwing an object at him on Friday, Nov. 3, 2017 at 7:55 p.m. in the vicinity of East 167 St. and Findlay Ave. in the Bronx.
- **3.** Wanted for punching a 64-year-old Conductor in the face at approximately 1:10 p.m. on Aug. 7, 2017, on board a N train at the Ditmars Blvd. station in Astoria, Queens, after being told to stop using the handrails to do pull ups.
- **4.** Wanted for striking a 60-year-old subway Conductor in the head with his fist or object from behind as the Conductor was monitoring the platform from the cab of his Q train on June 19, 2018, at approximately 11:51 a.m. at the Prospect Park Station in Brooklyn. The Conductor fell to the floor of the cab and lost consciousness. His injuries included an abrasion to the right side of his face, bruising and swelling.
- 5. Wanted for punching a 39-year-old Cleaner on Sunday, June 24th, 2018, at approximately 8:40 a.m. inside the 175th St. (D line) station in the Bronx.
- **6.** Wanted for repeatedly punching and trying to pull a 62-year-old Conductor out of the cab of his A train at approximately 4:40 a.m. Saturday, Aug. 11, 2018, at the Grant Ave. station in Brooklyn.
