Obituary

Louis Giles Moore was born on May 20, 1954 in Kingston, Jamaica, the son of the late Wilford Henry Moore and Isadora Moore. He emigrated from Jamaica to the United States in 1969, and resided in Queens, NY until his passing on April 24, 2013.

Louis graduated from Andrew Jackson High School in Cambria Heights, NY in 1972. His quest for knowledge and deep insights were a hallmark of his life. From high school he went on to study at various colleges within the City University of New York starting with Queens College in Flushing, NY and continuing on at York College in Jamaica, NY, where he conducted his initial research on electro-magnetism. He also studied at New York City College of Technology in Brooklyn, NY and at the Vaughn College of Aeronautics and Technology in Flushing, NY.

He had a lifelong passion for scientific research, and especially in the area of alternative energy systems which could minimize electrical consumption. His research led him to author the book, “The Ankh: African Origin of Electro-magnetism” under his pen name Nur Ankh Amen in 1999. He was deeply spiritual and a student of history, Egyptology and the Bible, as reflected in his book, and his various lectures and interviews over the years.

Louis pursued several career paths concurrently with his ongoing research in alternative energy, including as an artist and as a designer and maker of one-of-a-kind custom jewelry. At the time of his sudden and tragic passing he had served eight years with the MTA, New York City Transit as a signal maintainer.

He was a loving and devoted father to his three children, always providing guidance and counsel in his own tender loving way. Louis was a beloved son and brother. There was a special bond of love and friendship with his two brothers. He was a role model to his parents, brothers, children, cousins and friends on living a life full of independent thinking, creativity, quiet and spirituality and unending passion.

Louis leaves to mourn, his daughters, Amira Moore and Shalaine Gray; his son, Nassar Moore; two brothers, Denis Moore and Colin Moore; one granddaughter, Amina Page; his stepmother, Grethel Moore; an aunt, Brizela Sewell; his former wife Pamela Moore; two nieces, and a host of cousins, friends and co-workers.
