



Safety is priority number one for your Local 100 officers and shop stewards in the Stations Department. That's why we have been speaking out, and demonstrating, on the issue of assaults, including the heinous attack on our Brother CTA Anthony Nelson.

We are demanding justice, and that means a very stiff prison sentence for the career criminal who cowardly attacked Antony Nelson at the Pelham Bay Station in the Bronx on Aug. 11. Nelson was responding to rider reports that a man was harassing women outside when he was jumped by Alexander Wright.

The Stations Department has held five rallies and press conferences at the Bronx Courthouse so far. More are planned. The next one will be on Dec. 15.

These actions aren't just about CTA Nelson. It's about all of us. Judges and politicians must get our message that they need to apply the current laws on the books, make further changes to bail reform provisions, and start meting out real punishment in order to deter future acts of violence. At the same time, we also are supporting efforts by Mayor Adams and

Gov. Hochul to provide more psychiatric and housing services for those who have serious mental illness problems. No one knows better than us that there must be constant and strong initiatives to get more subway dwellers out of the system and into better situations.

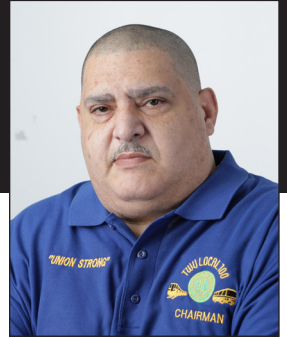

AROUND THE DEPARTMENT



A WIN FOR OUR COLLECTING AGENTS

Swift action by Local 100 ensured that our Collecting Agents could continue to do their jobs safely after the state adopted a law banning licensed gun owners from bringing weapons into designated "sensitive zones" like the subway system.

The law was necessary because the Supreme Court previously issued a ruling making it much easier for New York residents to carry legally owned firearms. But the law failed to grant an exemption for our Collecting Agents who are issued handguns to protect themselves and co-workers who collect revenue from the system.

We flagged the legal flaw and arranged with management for Collecting Agents to receive provisional certificates until they could take the necessary steps to be classified as security guards.

PROMOTIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

There's a path for Station Agents to become Collecting Agents and earn \$1.13 more an hour. You must have three years on the job, and you must meet management's time-and-attendance criteria. But Transit will pay qualified candidates the costs associated with obtaining a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) and gun permit.

Cleaners, meanwhile, also can get management to pay for the training required for a CDL and can then pick into driver positions in the refuse department.

BETTER CONDITIONS IN STATIONS FACILITIES

We have been bringing to management your complaints about facilities that are in unacceptably poor condition. Management has now agreed to a joint union-management inspection initiative. Defects will be identified, and we will press management to make repairs.
