### ***US Labor History: History of Public Sector Workers in the Transportation Industry***

*While often marginalized, public sector workers and their organizations have played a vital role in the development of the state, economy and society of the United States. Today, public sector workers account for 40% of the unionized workforce in the US, outpacing the private sector by almost two-to-one. This course will examine the history and development of unions in the public sector, with a special concentration on mass transportation workers.*

Courses offered one night a week. **US Labor History** can be the first 4 CUNY credits towards your 16 credit **Labor Studies Certificate** and a **College Degree!**

The Murphy Institute's *Certificate in Labor Studies* is a 16-credit program designed for individuals who want to study the social, political and cultural impact that the organization of work has on employees and their communities. The certificate offers students an understanding of work, workers and labor organizations.

**Course Location/Schedule:** During the Fall 2016 Semester, the U.S. Labor History course will be held at the Training and Upgrading Fund, 4th floor 195 Montague Street. The class will be offered on Thursdays from 5:30pm – 8:50pm.

Other classes may be held at the Murphy Institute (25 W. 43<sup>rd</sup> St. 19<sup>th</sup> Floor) or the Worker Institute at Cornell (16 E. 34<sup>th</sup> St. 6<sup>th</sup> Floor) in Midtown Manhattan.

**Admission:** High school diploma or proof of GED required for admission. Open to eligible TWU members (please visit the [Tuition Reimbursement site](#) for details). Deadline to apply is **July 25, 2016** for the term beginning in late August 2016.

**Course Credit and Tuition:** This course earns 4 undergraduate credits from CUNY School of Professional Studies. Tuition is \$275.00 per credit OR \$1100.00 per course *for New York State Residents*. There is a \$70 application fee (reimbursable by the TUF), a \$15.00 student activity fee and a \$62.50 technology fee each term (payable by the student).

When you complete the course you will be reimbursed for the tuition and eligible fees. If you drop out/fail or otherwise do not succeed in completing the class, you **will not** be reimbursed. There is a payment plan available through CUNY if you cannot lay out all the money at once.
